With this in mind I try to distribute it within days of the monthly operations team meeting so it is as up to date as possible. This month's is a little later to catch the quarterly Trust meeting that was held on the 15th July.

OPERATIONS NEWS

1. The Operations Team Meeting

Was held at the Sports Club on Monday 8th July. The next one will be on Monday 19th August 2019 at 6.30pm in the Sports Club. Members of the Public are welcome to raise ideas, problems or questions in the Public session which will last for a maximum of 15 minutes at the start of the meeting.

2. Grounds Maintenance (Jason/Andy/Wayne)

With the Funfair, Retro and Fun Day, Somerstock, Circus and Wessex 10k we think that the fields will see more use by the Community this summer than ever before.

Whilst we have learned much from these events and have encountered minor irritations and challenges; the success of these events has really been unrivalled, and they have received fantastic support from the community. Feedback has been overwhelmingly positive.

Meanwhile the MUGA is seeing growing use with some high quality one to one football training aimed at elite junior players and the fields are receiving good use on the two rounders pitches

On the whole the grounds remain in excellent condition and through August we will see the return of football training and some pre-season friendlies.

3. Buildings Maintenance (Jake)

A contractor has been appointed to complete the electrical certification work in the Clubhouse.

Jake is working hard to try to progress the commissioning of repairs to the floors of the temporary changing rooms.

We are still awaiting a quote for the potential provision of lighting from the Clubhouse to the MUGA. Andy suggested that we consider relocating the Tea Shed at the same time (with power supply) to stop people using it to climb into the MUGA.
